3. School Reports
 - a. PTA Report – Meghan Looper/Valerie Stormont — Looper reported PTA needs a fall fundraising coordinator to help Whitney Childers with RallyMe online to help coordinate assemblies. Person will also help make a video for fundraising and set up prizes for grade levels. Need bake sale coordinator to help Augusta Comey. Need help with hospitality committee. Volunteers still needed for art showcase and family fun party. Last PTA meeting is May 4 at 11:00.
 - b. SIC Chair Report – Elissa Wiscomb — SAGE testing is starting in May. Families are encouraged to make sure kids eat a healthy breakfast, rest and come to school on time. Field Day, run by PE teacher Ms. Ellie, will take place May 29 and 31. Volunteers will be needed to run stations. Playworks training took place. A teacher from each grade level attended. Teachers found it empowering and inspiring. They are already seeing positive effects on the playground. Their information will be presented Monday, April 23 to others. Will be implementing program this spring by teaching four games and will be fully implemented this fall.

 - i. Bryant Middle School Update — Plan is moving forward for collaboration between Salt Lake Center for Science Education and Bryant. Principal at Bryant will hold a retreat over the summer for all the teachers. By 2020, plan is to move seventh and eighth graders from SLCSE to Bryant. Next year there will be two different tracks for students. Track One is intensive math/science — longer math and science classes along with electives. Track Two will be a more traditional schedule.
 - ii. Coffee & Cocoa with Candler; April 26th at 8:00 AM in the Conference Room — If families ever want to donate gift cards to school — such as from Smith’s — they can be distributed to families in need. Additionally, donating to the Salt Lake Education Foundation and specifying Wasatch Elementary helps the school support families in need. That can help pay for school lunch bills, after school activities and others.
 - iii. SAFE Neighborhoods Program — 96 Hour Kit Community Fair at Wasatch (Update; Fair to be held on Saturday, April 21st) — two people will be selling food and kits. Salt Lake Regional and LDS Hospital will be there. A Stop the Bleed training program will take

place. Various emergency groups including Red Cross will attend. Event has been well publicized at local schools and churches, as well as banners posted in the neighborhood.

iv. Installation of security camera at front door/front door locked during school hours — Parents are asked not to leave kids at locked door without bringing them into office.
