a. Faculty report/SIC - Dawn Ann Bullough

- i. Creative, kid-produced thank you for Little Ceasar's for pizza donation nearly complete
 - ii. It's School Improvement Plan (SIP) season
- iii. Parent-teacher conferences and Book Fair scheduled during week of February 21
- iv. National Library Week is 4/6/17, the week before spring break; Dawn Ann has different daily activities including a reading from Wasatch parent-authors

- i. 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purchase. Questions from the group: Is monitor robust? low-maintenance? accurate? different than what's already available from the state or federal agencies? for indoor or outdoor use?
