I can't believe how quickly this year has gone by and that 2020 is almost here. December has been such a busy month, and we hope that you are able to enjoy some downtime over the winter break.



Outdoor Air Quality Information

Dear Parents:

In recent years we have seen inversions, fires and other factors affect our outdoor air quality. There is concern about the effects of poor air quality on children's health and their ability to breathe easily. Because of this, our school has adopted an outdoor air quality policy.

What will the school do?

We will check the Particulate Matter (PM2.5) levels. This information will guide our outdoor physical activities.

- 1. When the PM2.5 level is between 35.5-55.4 ug/m³, we will let "sensitive" students and students experiencing respiratory symptoms, such as with a cold or allergies, stay indoors.
- 2. When the PM2.5 level is above 55.5 ug/m³, outdoor recess will be cancelled for all children and alternative play/exercise opportunities will be offered indoors. Principals or their designees may exercise their discretion and allow affected students to stay indoors at lower PM2.5 levels.

What should parents do?

- 1. Parents, with advice from your health care provider, need to contact the school secretary or nurse if your child is "sensitive" to poor air quality.
- 2. Sensitive children may include those with significant or poorly controlled asthma, cystic fibrosis, chronic lung disease, congenital heart disease, compromised immune systems, or other respiratory problems.
